KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY'S LITTLEST CITIZENS SAFE



The foundation-sponsored **Car Seat Safety Net Program** has been helping keep children and infants safe for over 15 years. Partnered with Salem Health front-line care providers from the hospitals Mother/Baby, Neonatal Intensive Care, and Pediatric Units, the program ensures that no child or infant leaves the hospital without a safe ride home — in a car seat that meets current safety standards.

The program provides families who do not have the resources to secure a safe car seat for their children or

newborns. Sometimes families bring in used or older car seats that have expired or are unsuitable for use. Hospital staff identifies families in need, and at the time the child or newborn is discharged, provide them with a brand new car seat.

Since the program's inception, this program has protected nearly 600 of our community's tiny and most precious citizens. The foundation is grateful to the many generous donors who can make this program a reality through their support.
